

DEPARTMENT 7 - POULTRY RULES GOVERNING EXHIBITS

1. Each exhibitor is limited to 10 entries.
2. Cage rent of \$0.50 per cage will be charged, and collected on entry day. A cleaning deposit of \$1.00 per bird will also be collected. Deposit will be returned if conditions of rules no. 15 and no. 16 are met.
3. The exhibitor must verify date of hatching and the date of purchase and location that the birds came from. All poultry must have been owned by exhibitor at least 2 months before the fair.
4. All poultry and waterfowl must originate from flocks designated as U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or NPIP Affiliate flock and accompanied by a NPIP certificate or originate from a Wisconsin Tested Flock or Wisconsin Associate Flock and be accompanied by an enrollment certificate provided by the department certifying that they are a Wisconsin Tested Flock or Wisconsin Associate Flock. Sexually mature birds that do not meet these requirements may qualify with documentation of a negative test for pullorum-typhoid (and *Mycoplasma gallisepticum* for turkeys) conducted within 90 days prior to arrival at the exhibition, and be individually identified with a wing band or leg band. For regulatory purposes, domesticated fowl are considered to be sexually mature at 4 months. Turkeys are considered to be sexually mature at 6 months. Turkeys that are not going directly to slaughter may not be commingled with other poultry. This may be accomplished by separate housing or controlling the air flow or placement and spacing to prevent movement of *M. gallisepticum* from other poultry to the turkeys. The fair veterinarian should make this decision.
5. Birds should be treated for mites prior to arrival at the fair.
6. Any bird showing symptoms of sickness will be removed from show room and cared for, and exhibitor notified.
7. Cages, food, water, and pine shavings will be furnished by the Fair, Inc. Precautions will be taken to guard against accident or loss; but in no case will the Fair, Inc. be responsible for loss or accident from any cause.
8. So far as possible all single entries will be cooped singly, but the Fair reserves the right to coop two specimens in a single coop if it becomes necessary.
9. The show will be cooped in a classified manner as to variety and sex.
10. Exhibitors and visitors will be prohibited from handling birds other than their own without the consent of the owner.
11. The judge will be authorized to disqualify any bird he feels is unworthy as an entry.
12. All awards will be made by comparison, the judge using as a guide the latest "American Standard of Perfection."
13. Immediately after the awards have been made, a card stating the premium will be placed on the coop, and must remain there until the close of the show. No names, advertising matter or decoration not provided and placed by the Fair, Inc. will be permitted until after awards have been made. Exhibitors will then be allowed to advertise. No one may bring in other birds to sell without

the superintendent's permission, and those birds must also be accompanied by proof of a negative pullorum-typhoid test within the last 90 days.

14. Terms used are defined as follows:

Cock- A male bird hatched before January 1 of this year

Hen - A female bird hatched before January 1 of this year

Cockerel- A male bird hatched on or after January 1 of this year

Pullet- A female bird hatched on or after January 1 of this year

15. Exhibitors need to keep birds watered and fed, and to keep trays and floor under their cages clean daily.

16. No birds will be removed before 5:00 p.m. on Sunday. In order to have cage cleaning deposit returned, exhibitors are required to clean under their animals before leaving the grounds.
