The Clothing Revue judging for youth ages 14 and older will be held prior to the Fair, and judging for youth under age 14 will be held at the fair, following the clothing construction judging on Thursday.

In order to receive premiums for Clothing Revue the exhibitor must exhibit the outfit as Clothing Revue at the Fair. Enter outfit on the Fair Entry Blank and bring outfit on entry day.

Outfit may be entered in Clothing Construction also (Class C). State Fair delegates and alternates will be chosen from 14 and older blue ribbon winners.
